## A Message from the President

Thank you for your steadfast support of Spring Arbor University. We deeply treasure your partnership as we continue to deliver a comprehensively Christian liberal arts education that prepares students to serve Christ and His Kingdom. In this season of multiple voices competing for our attention, we remain focused on listening to God Almighty – El Shaddai – whose voice alone guides our mission to educate for Christ and His Kingdom.

The current landscape in Michigan and nationally presents both significant challenges and opportunities for Spring Arbor University's distinctive mission. We are actively engaged in advocacy efforts regarding federal legislation that would potentially impact finances for our neediest students. One provision that could significantly impact Christian higher education includes "risk-sharing" requirements that would measure institutional success solely by reviewing graduates' median salaries – a metric that fails to capture our true purpose of Kingdom service and penalizes institutions for graduating students going into ministry and other service-oriented positions that traditionally provide lower salaries. Additionally, we continue defending religious liberty as state budget proposals attempt to restrict student grants at institutions that uphold biblical convictions about marriage, sexuality, and gender identity. Through it all, we choose not to fear what others fear, but to trust in God's sufficiency and faithfulness.

Despite these headwinds, God's blessings abound across our campus community. Here are key highlights that demonstrate our commitment to excellence while remaining anchored in Christ:

- Spiritual Vitality: God continues to move powerfully among our students, with numerous decisions for Christ and baptisms throughout the year. Our spiritual formation programs – Chapel services, discipleship groups, mission opportunities, and resident chaplain ministry – continue to shape students into mature followers of Christ who can engage culture with both truth and grace.
- Strategic Growth: As we prepare to launch our 2025-2030 Strategic Plan, we celebrate the success of our newer programs in nursing and engineering while maintaining our commitment to the liberal arts. These additions strengthen rather than diminish our holistic educational approach, equipping students for diverse Kingdom callings.
- Financial Stewardship: God's provision has been evident through strong enrollment growth and fiscal management, effectively balancing our budget once again. Our Advancement team has also brought in more revenue than anticipated as we move into the public phase of our Ignite comprehensive campaign – having raised over \$65 million toward our \$80 million goal.
